All requests for involvement of NEPS Psychologists are made through the school principal. Each school has an assigned NEPS Psychologist and a dedicated allocation of service time. Following the implementation of the Continuum of Support process by school staff, the school may consult with NEPS about particular pupils who continue to show significant levels of difficulty. This consultation may take the form of a 'Teacher Consultation' or a more formal 'Request for Involvement of Psychologist'.

HSE PRIMARY CARE, CHILD, ADOLESCENT & FAMILY PSYCHOLOGY SERVICE

Psychologists see a broad range of children and adolescents who present with a variety of psychological difficulties.

Appropriate referrals to the Psychology service include the following:

- Emotional problems (e.g. Low Mood, Anxiety, Bereavement)
- · Behavioural problems at home
- · Assessment of Developmental Delay / Neurodevelopmental disorders
- · Attachment/separation difficulties
- · Therapeutic support following emotional, sexual or physical abuse
- Psychological factors in medical illnesses (e.g. living with diabetes, asthma)

HSE PSYCHOLOGY IN PRIMARY CARE

For children and young people 0-18 years

The Psychology Service for Children & Adolescents provides a wide range of assessment and therapeutic services for children and adolescents up to the age of 18 years. Referral to the HSE Mayo Primary Care.

Psychology Service (via standard referral form) can be initiated by Parents, GPs, Public Health Nurses, other Psychologists, school/NEPS, Child Care Workers, Counsellors, Speech and Language Therapists, and other Health Care Professionals. Parental permission is required for referral.

HSE CHILD & ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE (CAMHS)

This service provides Mental Health services up to the age of 18 years who have moderate to severe mental health disorders, that require the input of a specialist multi-disciplinary mental health team, including:

- · Moderate to severe depression
- Mood disorders
- Psychosis
- · Anxiety disorders
- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- · Moderate/severe eating disorders
- Suicidal behaviours
- · Suicidal ideation where intent is present

CAMHS, for children & young people aged 0-18 years

Referrals to the service are accepted from health care professionals including GPs,-Consultant Liaison/General Adult Psychiatrists, Paediatricians, NEPS

Psychologists, Tusla staff, community based Clinicians and Assessment Officers – as defined under the Disability Act, 2005. All referrers must work in collaboration with the child's GP, which means the referrer must ring the GP and discuss and agree the potential referral so that it is a truly collaborative referral

DRUG & ALCOHOL SERVICES

The Mayo Drug service works with adults and young people who want help to deal with drug and/or alcohol problems and want to build a healthier happier life for themselves. Support is also offered to friends, families and carers.

HSE ADULT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE

HSE ADULT MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE, for adults 18+

Access to this service is made via GPs, Westdoc (out of hours) or via the Emergency Department of Mayo University Hospital, Castlebar. The Mental Health Service consists of 5 Community Mental health teams with each team covering a particular area of the county. Referrals are made to the community multi-disciplinary team that covers the area of your address. Referrals are discussed by the Multi-Disciplinary Team, and appointments are offered accordingly. The multi-disciplinary team typically includes a Clinical/ Counselling Psychologist, Social Worker, Occupational Therapist, Addiction Counsellor, Psychiatrist, Non-Consultant Hospital Doctors, Nurse Therapists and Mental Health Nurses. The adult mental health service also has an in-patient facility called the adult mental health unit which is located in Mayo University Hospital in Castlebar
